### President's Report



#### **DEAR MEMBERS OF THE FRIENDS**

On behalf of the Executive Committee, I have the pleasure of presenting the 68<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the Association of The Friends of King's College (Inc) for 2022.

2022 remained challenging with the pandemic causing periodic interruptions to regular school activities and this affected our Friends events. We were very lucky to have been able to hold several events in some form and we look forward to returning to our full schedule in 2023. The events we could hold were extremely successful, due to the great support we received from you - whether volunteering your time to arrange events or coming along and enjoying them.

Your support delivered excellent results despite the circumstances. The Friends Committee were pleased to return the sum of \$568,814 back into the College community in 2022, including a large contribution to the Performing Arts Centre.

At the 2022 AGM we bid farewell to resigning members Jo Eddington and Jon Soydinc and welcomed aboard onto the committee Nicky Hall, Mel Guan, Jamie Norwell and Ashley Renshaw.

### FRIENDRAISING AND FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES IN 2022

#### **HEADMASTERS GARDEN PARTY**

The Headmasters Garden Party was cancelled in 2022 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

#### **GOLF DAY**

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Golf Day was cancelled in 2022.

#### **LADIES LUNCH**

This is an event that always sells out quickly. After being cancelled in 2021 due to COVID-19 restrictions, this year's Ladies Lunch was held in the beautiful surroundings of the Northern Club. Participants enjoyed a delicious lunch while listening to guest speaker Simon Gault, the chef and TV personality, sharing his life experiences with us. We thank him for giving his time to support our event. We acknowledge our gold sponsor Orsini Fine Jewellery and thank Sarah Hutchings for her continuing support for this event. We are also indebted to all the other businesses that support this event and donate items to be part of the auctions. Our Master of Ceremonies Hamish McKay kept us all on track and did a marvellous job. The event was run by Jo Eddington and Anne Wight and returned a net surplus of \$15,249.

#### KING'S IN THE CITY

King's in the City is now in its fourth year with the objective of fostering interactions between parents. This event involves a lunch with a keynote speaker at the Northern Club. The speaker this year was Andrew Grant, a board member of McKinsey & Co. and a King's parent. Andrew gave a fascinating presentation about his experience working in many countries, particularly in China, and the challenges we need to be mindful of to remain competitive.



#### **ART EXHIBITION**

The 2022 Art Exhibition was a great success. A committee of over 50 members led by Pru Mandeno, Julie Mathias, Eileen Harrison and Juliet Moore put together the event, held from Friday 28 October until Sunday 30 October. Many more volunteers assisted in set up week and helped over the weekend of the sale.

Artwork was exhibited from artists throughout New Zealand consisting of indoor painting, photography, sculpture, glass, ceramics, outdoor sculpture, student art, photography and technology. As in previous years, the opening event on the Friday night was a great success. The event benefitted hugely from the infrastructure put in place in previous years, namely the new structure of the covered tennis court and the new data collection/website/point of sale system developed for the Art Sale. We are grateful to Hobson Wealth for their Gold Sponsorship.

The art selection team did a wonderful job of balancing the different genres, price points and tastes in art. There certainly seemed to be something for everyone and the standard of the artwork exhibited were incredibly high. Artists tell us that they appreciate the friendly and professional approach of the King's team.

Huge thanks to the Arts Exhibition committee members and helpers for their generous contribution of time, energy, and passion over the many months of planning and organisation, culminating in an amazing weekend of art. This event was returned a fantastic surplus of \$143,633.



#### PRE-OWNED UNIFORM SALES

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the 2021 pre-owned uniform sale was delayed to January 2022, the week before the start of school and we had a second one in November. This enabled us to raise an amazing \$46,541.

Mary Jones and Hayley Whatuira worked tirelessly over the year to support this initiative and I thank them both for their hard work and dedication.

If anyone has any outgrown school uniform, please let us know as we need to build our stocks back up again!

#### THE VOLUNTEERS PROGRAMME

Over and above events that the Friends put on, there are further activities that are supported by parents which are hugely valuable giving extra pairs of hands to specific areas of the College. We thank all those that give their time to support the Tuck Shop, the Library and the Exam Reader/Writer programme.

#### **DONATIONS AND FUNDING IN 2022**

The Friends raised (incl. donations) a total of \$273,297 in 2022. The Friends Committee accepts funding requests throughout year. These are reviewed with the College and the Committee then allocates monies to benefit all areas of the College community, including to support the Houses, the Arts and Music Programmes and larger community projects such as the resurfacing of the Greenbank sports surfaces and the cricket nets.

In 2022, the Friends supported school projects for \$68,814, less than in prior years partly because of reduced school activity during the year. In addition, The Friends made a contribution of \$500,000 to the Performing Arts Centre.

#### IN CONCLUSION
